

Break-ins in Four Hills Village

Editor's note: during the past year, there have been a series of break-ins in Four Hills. Most of them have occurred on homes that back onto the golf course. Typically, the thief throws a large landscaping rock through the sliding glass doors at the back of the house. If an alarm goes off, he runs. If no sound (and no one sees him, as he is not on the street side), he just walks through the broken glass doors. Typically he is after just three classes of valuables: guns, cash, and jewelry. Here is the story of one individual who has been hit multiple times:

We live on Cuatro Cerros Trail SE and we have had four incidents of a male individual wearing a light colored hoodie entering our home or attempting to enter our home illegally. Our home was first broken into sometime on August 8-9, 2015 while we were out of town. The individual gained entry by throwing a rock and shattering a sliding glass door. The individual gained entry into our home and ransacked our house and stole several items. The second incident occurred over the Labor Day Weekend when the individual stole a TV from our screened porch that was locked while we were asleep. The third incident occurred on Columbus Day and the individual entered our home while we were asleep and stole my wife's purse. Our alarm system was engaged and our monitoring service called us at 12:02am about the intruder who was caught on camera leaving our property with my wife's black purse in hand, The fourth incident occurred on Wednesday, November 4th at about 7:30pm. We were not at home. I was on my way to my house when I received a call from our alarm monitoring service that there was glass breakage in one of our master bedroom windows. When I arrived home I found the window shattered. The individual used a large object to break the window causing the alarm to be engaged. The individual did not gain entry and he was observed on camera entering and leaving our property. All of these incidents have been reported to the Foothills Area Command. The police are investigating and they have pictures of a male individual suspected of the robbery in the early hours on Columbus Day and the attempted break in on November 4, 2015.
